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Text 1: A dangerous job? The best Con Artist* in the world

***Con artist:** criminal who steals from people by telling them lies.

Frank Abagnale, a good-looking English boy, pretended to be a pilot, a doctor and a lawyer. For five years, he travelled the world for free, stayed in expensive hotels and had relationships with beautiful women.

Abagnale was an international mystery. He was wanted by the FBI and Interpol (international Police) Abagnale's charisma was his most important tool. Everybody believed everything he said. Leonardo Di Caprio, who plays Frank Abagnale in the film *Catch me if you can*. said, 'Frank Abagnale is one of the greatest actors who has walked this earth.'

When Frank's German mother divorced his father, Abignale ran away from home and began his life of illegal activity as an international con artist. He got a Pan Am pilot's uniform by saying that his had been stolen and that he had an urgent flight. This allowed him to stay in the hotel he wanted: Pan Am always paid the bill.

These days Abagnale doesn't need to trick anybody: he is a successful consultant. He advises companies on how to cheat their customers, and he also teaches at the FBI Academy. He wrote his autobiography in the 1970's and sold the film rights for \$ 250.000

As Frank Jr. grew interested in women, he found that he could not stop spending money on them. To finance his adventures with the opposite sex, he asked his father for a credit card to get gas for the truck his father gave him. He began to make deals and to falsely charge items to his fathers 'card. In return the employee at the gas station got to keep the item and "resell" it for the full price and Frank got a portion of the money. Over two months, Frank Jr "bought" 14 sets of tires, 22 batteries, and large quantities of gasoline.

Frank's father discovered what Frank was doing only after a bill collector contacted him in person. According to *Catch Me If You Can*, Frank Sr. was not angry with his son, but was confused as to his motive. Both he and the bill collector understood when Frank Jr. explained that "It's the girls, Dad, they do funny things to me. I can't explain it".

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Text B

Was Fred Flintstone a Vegetarian?

Millions of years ago, when our ancestors lived in the tropical forests of Central Africa, they probably ate plants and fruit, and occasionally a few insects. And this is probably how people lived for millions of years, eating plants, seeds, fruits, nuts, vegetables and occasionally a little meat.

The ancient civilizations of the Aztecs and Incas ate a lot of cereals, beans, fruit and not much meat at all. In classical India most people didn't eat meat and the Japanese were mainly vegetarian until a few generations ago.

It was during the nineteenth century that people in Western countries suddenly began to eat a lot more meat. New methods helped to reduce the price of meat for ordinary people. It was at this time that the typical western meal of meat, potatoes and vegetables was born.

Also, during the nineteenth century the vegetarian movement started in Europe and the USA. But it was only in the 1960s that more and more people in the West decided to give up meat in their diets. Many people decide to become vegetarian for personal reasons. First, some people think that it is healthier not to eat meat. Others believe that it is cruel to eat animals. Today vegetarianism is more and more popular in Europe and the USA. However, vegetarians are still a very small minority in most countries.

A 1999 study combined data from five studies from western countries. The study reported mortality numbers, where lower numbers indicated fewer deaths, for fish eaters to be .82, vegetarians to be .84, occasional meat eaters to be .84. Out of the major causes of death studied, only one difference in mortality rate was attributed to the difference in diet, as the conclusion states: "vegetarians had a 24% lower mortality from heart disease than non-vegetarians, but no associations of a vegetarian diet with other major causes of death were established."
